







California School Counseling Video (2019)		This short video highlights the need for student mental health services, the recent increases in the California school counseling workforce as a beginning step to investing in more school counselors for the benefit of students.
COVID-19 Planning Considerations and Resources: Addressing Staff & Student Mental School for Re-Entry		This document was distributed to thousands of California superintendents/educators outlining a three-prong re-opening process focused on student and staff mental health.
Fostering the Whole Child: A Guide to School-Based Mental Health Professionals (2020)		Document delineates the roles and responsibilities of California School-Based Mental Health Professionals. This was a joint project of the California Association of School Psychologists, CA School Social Workers & CASC.
Covid-19 Counseling Website (2020)		This open-sourced website was created by school counselors from Wisconsin and California to primarily address the mental health issues of students. It was launched two months after COVID-19 closed schools for in-person learning in March 2020. It remains a viable resource with individuals accessing this website from over 20 countries and throughout the U.S.A.
CASC Video: Creating Pathways, Healing Hearts (2021)		This 4-minute video speaks to the impact school counselors make in schools, including stories from parents, teachers, and students.
Joint Position Statement: Community Mental Health Partnerships		This position statement distributed to California decision makers was co-authored and approved by three boards of directors representing the interest of California's school counselors, school psychologists, and school social workers. It outlines mental health programs on school campuses
Information Brief: Cal Admin. Code 80049.1 (c) Supervision of non-PPS mental health service providers		PPS staff are required to supervise individuals who provide counseling services in grades PK-12. Those requiring supervision include but are not limited to volunteers, classified staff, pre-service interns, and licensed individuals.
